ISO Certification Milestone

Mama Ngina University College attained the prestigious ISO 9001:2015 Certification, a globally recognized standard for quality management systems. This achievement reflects the university's firm commitment to excellence, operational efficiency, and continuous improvement in the delivery of higher education services.

The certification followed a thorough audit and evaluation process that assessed the university's compliance with international best practices in areas such as academic administration, student support services, procurement, documentation, and risk management. It confirms that MNUC has in place well-structured systems and processes to consistently meet stakeholder expectations and regulatory requirements.

The certification not only enhances MNUC's credibility and competitiveness but also provides a framework for institutional growth and long-term quality assurance. Moving forward, the ISO standards will continue to guide internal practices, improve efficiency, and ensure that the university remains responsive to the evolving needs of students, staff, and partners.

Academic Collaboration with Freiburg University

MNUC had the honor of hosting Dr. Stefanie Harsch from Freiburg University, Germany. Discussions focused on potential collaborations, particularly in health sciences, aiming to enhance research opportunities and academic exchanges between our institutions. This partnership will foster international student and staff exchange programs, research collaborations, joint workshops/ conferences and joint academic initiatives that will further enrich our educational offerings.

Dr. Harsch is the Principal Investigator for the collaborative 'CaLioS' research project by the German Alliance of Global Health Research and funded by the German Federal Ministry of Education.



The project explores the Cancer Health Literacy (CHL) in Kenya through the use of the narratives, and a website 'Maisha Na Cancer' that features stories of cancer survivors. Other collaborators include Dr. Ruth Mbugua (Dean, School of Health Sciences here at MNUC) and Dr. Victor Oria, Integrated Cancer Research Foundation of Kenya (local Principal Investigator). Dr. Harsch also conducted Focus Group Discussions with our third year BSc. Nursing students who have been engaged in the research project as participants of the feasibility study

Student Leaders' Visit to the Senate

A delegation of 15 student leaders, accompanied by the Head of Student Affairs and Outreach, embarked on a study tour to the Senate. This visit provided our student leaders with a deeper understanding of legislative processes, governance, and public service, enriching their leadership journey.

The interaction with lawmakers and policy experts allowed them to gain firsthand knowledge of national governance structures and parliamentary procedures.

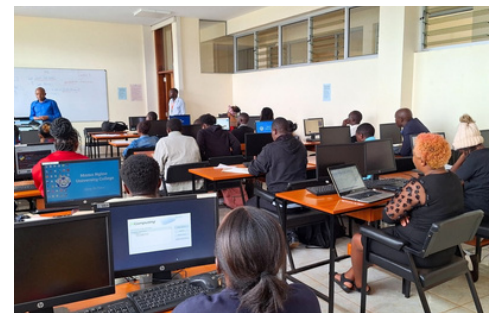


Expansion of Tuition Block

In response to the growing student population and the increasing demand for quality higher education, MNUC has embarked on the expansion of its tuition block. The ongoing construction project, set to be completed by the August 2025 intake, will provide additional lecture halls, modern laboratories, and office space for faculty. This development is expected to greatly enhance the learning environment, accommodate more students, and support the university’s strategic goal of offering a diverse range of academic programs.

ICT Infrastructure Expansion and Digital Learning Advancements

As part of our ongoing efforts to improve digital learning, MNUC has invested in upgrading its ICT infrastructure. The institution has installed high-speed internet across all lecture halls and research centers, ensuring seamless access to digital resources for students and faculty. Plans are also underway to introduce virtual learning platforms to support remote and hybrid learning models, enhancing flexibility in course delivery.



Hikvision Donation

MNUC took part in the Safe Campus and Smart Education Seminar by HikVision, joining 30 universities to explore 21st-century smart education technologies. Mr. Isaac Kuria, Head of ICT, represented Principal Prof. Zipporah Ng’ang’a and received an award for MNUC. The event was officiated by CPA. Aurelia Rono on behalf of PS Dr. Beatrice Inyangala.

SCHOOL ACHIEVEMENTS

SCHOOL OF HEALTH SCIENCES

Our nursing students were recognized for their outstanding performance in clinical rotations, with several students receiving internship opportunities at leading medical institutions.



SCHOOL OF PURE AND APPLIED SCIENCES

The school initiated a STEM outreach program targeting high school students, encouraging them to pursue careers in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics. (STEM)



SCHOOL OF BUSINESS, ECONOMICS, AND HUMANITIES

MNUC signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Kenya National Chamber of Commerce and Industry (KNCCI), Kiambu Chapter.

This partnership aims to foster entrepreneurship, research, and community development, providing students with practical business insights.

Entrepreneurship Bootcamp

The school successfully hosted an Entrepreneurship Bootcamp, where students engaged in business idea-pitching sessions, mentorship from industry leaders, and financial literacy training.



Botathon #10

In collaboration with BotLab and BotSpaces Africa, MNUC hosted BOTATHON #10, a competitive hackathon for aspiring software developers and robotics enthusiasts. Over 100 participants from universities across Kenya engaged in a two-day coding sprint to develop chatbots and AI-powered tools for education, health, and finance. Mentors from Microsoft Kenya and Safaricom Innovation Hub guided students through idea pitching and prototype building. Winners received mentorship slots and startup kits to pursue their ideas.



MoU with THiNK – Driving AI and Innovation

MNUC signed a groundbreaking Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Tech Innovators Network (THiNK). The partnership aims to expand opportunities in AI research, tech entrepreneurship, and capacity-building for faculty and students.

The MoU will see the co-creation of innovation labs, exchange programs, and mentorship sessions on emerging technologies. THiNK, an East Africa-based tech think tank, pledged to support MNUC in developing a student-led innovation hub.



KIEP-SKIES Rapid Tech Skills Program Graduation

The graduation of the second cohort under the KIEP-SKIES Rapid Tech Skills Program was marked by an exhibition of tech solutions developed by students in cybersecurity and data science. The event was officiated by Dr. Juma Mukhwana, Principal Secretary, State Department for Industry, who praised MNUC's role in closing Kenya's digital skills gap. Stakeholders from the World Bank and industry tech leaders were present to witness students' project demos, including data-driven health dashboards, cyber-audit apps, and smart energy monitoring prototypes. Graduates expressed readiness to enter the tech workforce or pursue entrepreneurship.
